Be Strong and Courageous

As the Children of Israel prepared to cross the Jordan River and enter the Promised Land, there was a wonderful, yet nasty world waiting for them. Isn't the same thing true for our children today?

As Israel prepared to enter Canaan, the Lord warned them about the polytheism, the "many god" worship of the Canaanites. He warned them about things like sexual promiscuity and perversion. He even found it necessary to warn against child sacrifice! Taken together, the Lord repeatedly referred to these things as "detestable practices."

The Lord earnestly warned his people because these practices had the potential to eat away at the foundations of their faith and undermine their relationship with the only true God.

Sound familiar?

Don't we live in a polytheistic society? Aren't there many "gods" out there vying for our time, our attention, our loyalty? How about sexual promiscuity and perversion? Or child sacrifice? How many "detestable things" surround us?!

This is the world in which we live. And this is the world into which our children are going. This could fill us with fear. It could cause us to be discouraged – even terrified. It could paralyze us - If we had to face it on our own. But the Children of Israel didn't. And we don't.

As he said to them, the Lord says to us: "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you" (Deuteronomy 31:6).

That is why Christian education – and the God-Bible-Jesus focus we are blessed to provide at GPLHS – is so important.

Our children need to know that the God who led his people into the Promised Land and blessed them there, goes with them. They need to know that the Savior who defeated sin, death, and the devil – the One who won forgiveness, life, and salvation for them and for the world – promises that he will never leave them or forsake them.
